Scholarship Programs

President's Scholarship

SPROUTS

During SPROUTS (Spring Program of Reading Outreach to Urban Teachers & Students, volunteers visit classrooms to read a farm-themed book, *Heartland*, to third graders and explain how farmers grow the world's food, fuel & fiber. Model tractors & farm equipment, and other visual aides like corn, soybeans and wheat, help students get the farming message. In 2013, a copy of the book *Who Grew My Soup* was donated to each



classroom. SPROUTS is supported

through a memorial fund in honor of Bob Konen, established by his family and friends.

Community Service

KCFB Foundation hunger relief efforts in recent years have provided the equivalent of 700,000 meals to Kane County residents who utilize the services of local food pantries. Harvest for ALL, started in 2009, has contributed greatly to that total. Farmers and Farm Bureau volunteers turn crop proceeds, farm products and cash gifts into food for the pantry of their choosing. In 2011 the program earned an ASAE Summit Award, the highest recognition an association can receive.

In 2013, our volunteers issued a *Million Meal Challenge*, with the goal of pushing cumulative hunger relief to 1 million meals in this,

the Kane County Farm Bureau's 100th year in the community. Local businesses were offered the chance to sponsor Centennial events and the Foundation matched 25% with a donation to the food pantry of the sponsor's choice. The response was terrific, with 21 sponsorships

generating thousands of dollars in donations to local food pantries - putting us well on our way to the *Million Meal Challenge* goal.

Winner's Choice Raffle

The 2013 **Winner's Choice Raffle** offers a classic prize in honor of KCFB's Centennial. A 1921 Ford Model T "Huckster" Produce

The Kane County Farm Bureau Foundation is an IRS 501(c)(3) charitable organization that supports education, leadership development, research & charitable activities for the benefit of agriculture and farm families. It was established to promote Education, Leadership Development & Research in agricultural fields. For the 2012-13, over \$25,000 has been committed in scholarships and internships to area college students pursuing careers in one of Illinois' largest industries, Agriculture.

FFA Chapter Grants

Established in 2009, FFA Chapter Grants recognize the contributions of Kane County FFA Chapters in the success of Foundation programs. In 2012, three Kane County Chapters capitalized on the grant, receiving a



total of \$1250 for participation in KCFB activities. Chapters are rewarded for the completion of a community service project. Grants of up to \$500 per chapter are available in 2013.

Internship Programs

Internships are offered by the Kane County Farm Bureau Foundation during summer, winter and mid-term breaks, to students who have completed 30 undergraduate hours. Structured to meet student needs, develop professional skills & build knowledge about agriculture.

Summer Ag Institutes

The Foundation provides support for KCFB Summer Ag Institutes & Agricultural



Tours for teachers. SAI1 is a graduate credit course on agricultural research, inputs, production, processing and marketing. The 1-week course provides a broad overview of Kane County farms, commodities and

agribusiness. SAI2 takes teachers outside the county to explore the ag industry by focusing on themes like feeding the world and supplying renewable energy.

U of I Extension Grant

An annual Foundation grant to U of I Extension, Kane County helps fund Extension's 4-H, youth education, food and nutrition programs.

National AITC

Annual participation in National AITC Conference tours, workshops, exhibits & contacts help keep local AITC materials and presentations up-to-date on the latest technology in agriculture.

Ag Literacy Library

The Foundation helps fund many Kane County Farm Bureau Ag Literacy Programs. The Ag Literacy Library at the Farm Bureau has hundreds of books with agricultural themes. Farm



Bureau members can check out books on topics ranging from vegetable gardening to children's stories about life on the farm. Thanks to donations and memorial contributions, the collection continues to grow.

Ag Days
